Accessory Do's And Don'ts

- If you're not familiar with accessorising, the golden rule "Less is More" is a safe way to go.
- When choosing your accessories keep them in proportion with the rest of your ensemble - you don't want them to be a distraction but to compliment your overall style.
- Choose your wedding gown first - think of your gown as the base from which you add to.
- Choose shoes as soon as you have chosen your dress as your heel height will determine the length of your hem.
- Once you've bought your shoes, wear them in for a while at home to avoid any painful blisters on your wedding day - painful feet are hard to smile about. If the soles are slippery give them a good going over with a light sandpaper to give them some grip.
- If your bodice is heavily detailed be careful not to over clutter your look with extravagant necklaces - a pair of simple diamante or pearl earring studs might be all that is needed.
- If you're wanting to achieve a period look, steer clear from modern-style jewellery. Search for antique or period costume jewellery - try looking in antique stores as well as your local recycle shop, you'd be surprised!
- Veils add a traditional touch, tiara's a true princess, while hair accessories make for a modern bride. Hats should match your shoes and handbag.
